#### Intro

- Becoming a CAP Pilot can be challenging.
- For many it is your first (or at least early)
   experience with eServices and the associated
   applications.
- The process *is* more complicated (and challenging) than just a flight review.

#### However...

- The rewards of dedicating your flying skills to the benefit of your community, state and nation should make the effort worthwhile!
- Your fellow members are here to help you succeed! Just ask.



#### Intro

- The first pilot rating is "VFR Pilot" and likely "VFR Pilot – G1000" since most of our aircraft are so equipped.
- You may combine your rating "checkrides" (e.g. IFR privileges) but this should be discussed with your instructor pilot (IP) and subsequently your check pilot (CP).
- You must take an initial ride for each aircraft type you want to qualify in (e.g. 172, 182, 206)



## Prerequisites

- FAA Rated Private (or above) ASEL
- 14 CFR § 61.56 (Flight Review) Current
- Current FAA (or Military) Flight Physical or Basic Med
- Hi Perf Endorsed to fly 182 and/or 206
- CAP OpSec and Level 1 Completed



## Prerequisites

- You should be current and proficient in the aircraft type you are planning to fly (e.g. 172 or 182)
- This includes G1000 skills if you are going to fly aircraft so equipped.
- It is recommended you fly with an IP prior to your evaluation to help you assess your readiness.



### CAPR 70-1

- CAP Regulation governing flight operations.
- Must have working knowledge of CAPR 70-1 to be a CAP pilot.






# Navigating eServices/OpsQual







### **Key Terminology**

- Mission All operational activities are attached to a mission.
- Mission Symbol The symbol defines the type of mission and funding source. C12 for preparation flights and C7 for your checkride.
- Sortie All aircraft flights are called sorties.
